Instructions for Authors (title)

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Abstract (Heading – abstract)

The abstract should summarise the contents of the paper in between 40 and 100 words. Note that paper title, author's name(s) and author's affiliation(s) should be centred. The paper title should be in 12-point, Times New Roman bold. Author's name and affiliation should be in 10 point Times Roman plain. The abstract should be in 10 point Times New Roman italic and should be justified (left and right flushed). Leave 12 points of space after the paper title, 12 points of space after the author's name(s) and 12 points of space after the author's affiliation(s) (or email address). Leave 24 points of space after the abstract. (Abstract style)

Keywords (Heading – minor)

A set of keywords must be included

INTRODUCTION (HEADING – MAJOR)




Figure 1: Two circles and a rectangle (Figure caption style)

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Any exhibits (tables, figures, illustrations etc. should be placed as close as possible to the first reference made to it. Exhibits should be numbered and identified by a brief description. For example, see Figure 1.
